Focus Weeds: the dandelion

We know spring has arrived when we drive through our neighborhoods, and they are dotted with yellow. It seems like dandelions just showed up in mass droves overnight. As kids, we loved picking bouquets of them for our moms or blow the puffs of seeds all over the yard. As adults, they drive us nuts and we just wish they would die.

Whether you love them or hate them, dandelions are among the most familiar plants in the world. They're one species that just about anyone can identify. Dandelions are, quite possibly, the most successful plants that exist, masters of survival worldwide. Nowadays, they're also the most unpopular plant in the neighborhood.

Why is this plant so hard to kill? Dandelions are fast growers, the sunny yellow flowers going from bud to seed in days. But they are also long-lived – an individual plant can live for years, so the dandelion lurking in a corner of the playground might be older than the children running past it. The root sinks deeper over the years and can go down 15 feet. They can take root disappear in the fall, they will in places that seem little short of miraculous, and then are impossible the spring. to get rid of. Like the Hydra who sprouted two new heads for every one that was cut off, the root clones when divided; a one-inch bit of dandelion root can grow a whole new dandelion.

Dandelions have long been prized for their medicinal uses and edibility. Their leaves are good sources of calcium, iron and potassium, as well as vitamins A & C. Dandelions are more nutritious than most of the vegetables in your garden. They have more vitamin A than spinach, more vitamin C than tomatoes. Its flow-



ers have been known to make dandelion wine and was historically an ingredient in root beer. Medicinally, it has been used all over the world as an herbal remedy to treat liver problems and infections.

In our lawns, the dandelion is just a nuisance. Their roots can grow up to 2 feet long and are brittle, so they easily break off if you try to pull them. If you don't remove the whole root, they will grow up again. These roots are usually deep enough that even though the surface dandelions survive the winter and re-grow in the season with a healthy lawn.

When the flower matures and turns into a puff ball, the wind can carry the thousands of seeds to germinate in any spot it can find. That's why your yard could be weed free one year and a field of dandelions the next.

The best control is to keep your lawn healthy and choke them out. Make sure your grass is well irrigated, leave the grass blades high when you mow (no less than 3"), leaving the grass clippings to provide nutrients, fertilize and overseed any bare

spots you may have.

If you are craving some time in the yard you can get out your gloves and start pulling the dandelions. Just be sure to get the whole root or they will be right back.

The easiest most effective way to kill the whole plant the first time is using a selective herbicide.

Ultimately, you will probably have dandelions grow in your yard every year, but you can keep it to a minimum by ending Having a lawn care professional maintain your yard is the best and least time-consuming way to keep your lawn green and strong, minus the yellow dandelion polka dots.

Fortunately, as far as the lawns were concerned, we had a pretty typical season: a rainy spring with mild temperatures followed by a not too hot summer. The overall precipitation was below average, so we did see some drought stress going into fall but mostly the lawns faired well.

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FAQs

Does this application need to be Why isn't my lawn greener? watered in?

In order for fertilizer to be effective, at some point it must be watered in. That being said, if we have ample rainfall, like in April and May, you shouldn't need to water. After mid-June, any treatment applied to your lawn will be far more effective once it is watered in.

If you have a sprinkler system that is on a regular timer, there is no need to change your schedule. A two to three day lag time will not negatively affect the application.

Can my pets go outside after a treatment?

It is best to wait an hour or so after a weed control treatment so that it has a chance to dry. I would caution you to make sure to wipe their paws before coming back in the house so they don't track it in.

Will the fertilizer burn my lawn?

During summer, when lawns stress from heat and lack of rain, we use products that are coated so they will not react with the lawn until it rains or you water. If your lawn is showing signs of stress after a treatment, it is far more likely that it is suffering from lack of water than from the fertilizer. However, anytime you are concerned about something in your lawn, it is best to contact us so we can diagnose the problem and take appropriate action.

Many things can affect the overallcolor of your lawn. The most common culprit is improper mowing. The optimal mowing height for bluegrass is three inches. Too often people cut the lawn shorter so they don't have to cut as frequently. even actively feeding until Septem-This removes too much moisture from the plant and lightens the color. Another common mowing problem is dull mower blades. Dull blades tear instead of cut cleanly resulting in a frayed brown grass blade.

Insufficient water will affect the color of the grass. Lawns need one inch of water per week to remain healthy and green.

If all of these factors are ruled out, we can adjust the rate of fertilizer being applied. Or we will reapply between scheduled treatments at no charge. Beware; this could result in the need to mow your lawn twice a week

I have patches of ugly grass that I think is crabgrass?

First off, if you have this concern and it is before mid July, it is not crabgrass. Most times, what you have is tall fescue. This is just a grass type that unfortunately grows in clumps and grows faster than your bluegrass and ryegrass lawn. The only effective way to control it is to remove it manually. Because it is just another type of grass, anything that will kill it will also kill the grass you want.

My neighbor or mowing service says I have grubs.

99% of the time they are wrong! Ask them to show you the actual grub worms; even if you do find one or two it takes a lot to cause visible damage. Grubs aren't really ber. In July and August most likely you are dealing with mower stress or a fungus. Proper diagnosis is required for a proper solution. Check with the expert.
